Detailed Narrative Description of Project: <p>NET was established in 2007 in accordance with the vision of his Majesty King Abdullah II to reduce poverty and unemployment. The goal of NET is to supply 30,000 trained workers for the construction industry over a four-year period. The project was designed as a public-private partnership among the Jordanian Armed Forces, the Ministry of Labour and the private sector to train and employ young Jordanians in the construction sector. Reporting to a Higher Steering Committee, the Armed Forces, through a Private Shareholding company (non-profit) the National Employment and Training (NET) program, functions essentially as a training and employment agency, selecting, hiring, and placing the trainees as employees in private sector companies.</p> <p>IDEA will provide an Evaluator to conduct a thorough and comprehensive assessment of the NET project through a multiple of deployments. The evaluation will cover four main areas: the Governance/Administration arrangements of NET; the Economics of NET; the Delivery (Training and Employment) Model; and the Quality of Outcomes</p>		
Description of Actual Services Provided: <p>The IDEA Evaluator reviewed NET's founding and operational documents including its charter, operating and administrative procedures, roles and responsibilities, as well as the mechanisms for tracking results including trainee data and evaluation reports.</p> <p>The first deployment, took place between February 23rd, 2000 and March 6th 2009, and succeeded in conducting a preliminary assessment of the military, a tracer study and an employer satisfaction survey. The Evaluator also conducted in depth interviews with key stakeholders including E-TVET Council, the E-TVET Fund, etc. to gain a clear understanding of NET's goals, objectives, structures.</p>
